## Logical Innovations supports NASA Technology Days expo Annual Cleveland event connects NASA with local industry, academia

**L**ogical Innovations Inc. provided management and logistical support to the NASA Technology Days expo held November 28-30 at the Cleveland Public Auditorium.

The three-day event and technology showcase connected a wide range of community representatives from local industry, academia, and the government to view technologies ready for commercialization, connect with supply chain partners, discuss opportunities to partner with NASA on technology development, and meet with major research companies to develop partnerships.

More than 80 technology sessions were on display at the event with a focus on industrial market sectors

of prime economic importance to the Midwestern United States.

In attendance were several NASA representatives including Associate Administrator, Robert Lightfoot Jr.; Chief Technologist, Mason Peck; Director of Space Technology Programs, Michael Gazarik; Glenn Research Center Director, Ray Lugo III.

Led by our own Dwayne Hunt, Logical Innovations team members from our Visitor Education and Community Outreach Support Services (VECOSS) contract provided setup and breakdown of the exhibit area booths and displays, exhibitor electrical services, exhibit hall signage and décor, event security during the event, and oversight throughout the event.

The Houston BoyChoir performed their winter concert at First Presbyterian Church of Houston with more than 800 attendees. It was sponsored by KUHF 88.7 Public Radio and KUHA 91.7 Classical Houston Public Radio. They also performed in this year's 50th Annual Heritage Society Candlelight Tour at Sam Houston Park.

The choir can also be seen performing before several local professional sporting events. They performed at a Houston Dynamo game earlier this year and will appear at the Rockets versus Mavericks game on March 3rd, and the Astros versus Rangers game on May 12th.

The Houston BoyChoir is a multi-level program that develops members skills from childhood to adulthood. It consists of a preparatory choir and chamber choir. Trace is part of the 45-member preparatory choir.

The chamber choir currently stands at 22 members and can be booked for special celebration such as galas, grand openings and weddings. Trace is trying out for chamber choir this month in the hopes of joining them on a tour of Africa next year.
